# The Holy Land <br> Israel: May 3-13, 2011

Monday, May 03: ATLANTA/OVERSEAS Depart Atlanta tonight on Delta's non-stop flight to Tel Aviv departing at $10: 15 \mathrm{pm}$. Dinner and breakfast are served enroute.

## Tuesday, May 04: ARRIVE TEL AVIV

 Our arrival is at 5:00pm at Ben Gurion Airport. Here we are met in the custom's hall by the World Travel Consultants representative who will assist with bags and meeting our guide for the transfer along the Mediterranean to Netanya. Our overnight and dinner is at the King Solomon Hotel.

Wednesday, May 05: TO THE GALILEE After breakfast we depart for Caesarea, built by King Herod and from which the Apostle Paul sailed on his hazardous journey to Rome. Here remain extensive ruins of the Roman Aqueduct and Amphitheater. We see Herod's Palace, hippodrome, the Crusader's city and walls. Lunch today is at Mizra. Driving toward Nazareth, we stop for a view of the valley of Esdrelon, or Biblical Armageddon. Then we continue to Cana of Galilee, where Jesus performed his first miracle. We arrive in Nazareth, childhood home of Jesus before ending the day in Tiberias at the Leonardo Plaza Tiberias Hotel on the Sea of Galilee, our accommodations for two nights. Enjoy an after-dinner stroll along the historic lake.

## Thursday, May 06: UPPER GALILEE



The Sea of Galilee is rich in memories of the three years of Jesus' ministry along its shores. This morning we begin our day with a boat ride from

Tiberias to Capernaum. The ancient synagogue reminds us of the Roman Centurion who built a synagogue there (Luke 7:5). Next we visit the church of "Do You Love Me;"then, drive to the Mount of Beautitudes for a lovely view of the Sea. Continuing through the Hula Valley we drive through Hazar, a city of strategic importance, and captured by Joshua.


After lunch we travel to Banias, one of the sources of the Jordan River. Here is located Caesarea Philippi, where Peter made his great confession of faith. We continue to Beit Seida, the land of the Gadarenes. Our day concludes with the opportunity of Baptism in the Jordan River (be sure to take shorts or a swim suit; robes are available at the site) before we return to Tiberias for dinner.

Saturday, May 07:GALILEE AND DEAD SEA We depart for Beit Shean then visit Ein Harol, and Gideon's Springs. After a light lunch we continue through the JordanValley to Ein Bokek and our accommodations at the
 deluxe Isrotel Hotel on the shores of the Dead Sea. This afternoon we enjoy an unusual but interesting Desert Safari with jeeps and drivers provided. We return to the hotel for dinner and overnight. Some may want to dip into the Dead Sea to experience the buoyant waters. Spa facilities are at our hotel for optional enjoyment.

## Sunday, May 08: MASADA/QUMRAN JERUSALEM



After breakfast we travel to the base of Masada a take the cable car to the top of this Jewish

Fortress. Here we see the excavations of King Herod's palace, the synagogue, the Roman camps, and the unique water system. After our descent we enjoy lunch at Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered. We ascent toward Jerusalem and get a first glimpse of this Holy City with a panoramic view from the Mt. of Olives. From the Church of the Lord's Prayer, we take a pleasant walk down the Palm Sunday road and Gethsemane. By coach we drive to the Leonardo Plaza Jerusalem Hotel, our home while in Jerusalem. Dinner at the hotel.

Monday, May 9: JERUSALEM/BETHLEHEM This morning we drive on edge of the Judean Hills to the Herodian. True to his legendary paranoia, Herod built his lavish and fortified palace and spared no luxury. We continue
 to the border at Bethlehem then meet our Palestinian guide and coach to visit Shepherd's Field and the Church of the Nativity. After lunch in Bethlehem we have time to shop before returning to Israel where we visit the model of Jerusalem giving us a view of the beginnings and growth of the city. Dinner is at our hotel.

Tuesday, May 10: JERUSALEM


This day begins at the Dung gate to the city where we visit the Western Wall known as the "wailing wall" We climb up to the Temple Mount where we view the El Aqusa Mosque and elaborate "Dome of the Rock" Mosque. We continue to the Pool of Bethesda and Church of Saint Ann where we experience the wonderful acoustics, the Sisters of Zion Convent (Pilate's judgment hall) then explore the Herodian Quarter. From there we walk to the Jewish Quarter including Byzantine main street (Cardo) and Broad Wall of King Hezekah, the Burnt

House and Museum. We return to our hotel for dinner.

## Wednesday, May 11: JERUSALEM-THE OLD

 CITY.Today we walk through the Kidron Valley to Gihon Springs where Solomon was anointed king 1 Kings: 1:38) and also visit the Pool of Siloam, the Tombs of Absalon, James, and Zach-
 iariah. We see more excavations of the city of David then view Hezekian's Tunnel. After lunch we walk through more of the old city as we follow the Via Dolorosa from Ecce Homo Arch to the Church of the Nativity. To feel with authenticity the antiquity of Jerusalem, one must walk the narrow streets and visit shops and Oriental bazaars of the Old City. We return to the hotel in the later afternoon.

Thursday, May 12: JUDEAN HILLS/HOMEWARD BOUND


After a leisure morning we check out of our hotel and travel to the desert of Judea from the Bell Tower of the Augusta Victoria. Our tour concludes with a visit to the Garden Tomb where we experience communion at this lovely site. After an early farewell dinner at the American Colony hotel we depart for Ben Gurion Airport for our late night non-stop flight to Atlanta.

Friday, May 13: USA
We arrive in Atlanta at 5:50am then clear customs before proceeding to our homes with fond memories of this trip-of-of-lifetime.

Air Transportation: Air transportation is for transatlantic economy class jet service on Delta Airlines. The airfare is based on a group contract fare with tariffs in effect September 9, 2010 from Atlanta to Tel Aviv roundtrip. U.S. and foreign airport taxes as well as fuel surcharges are included as of 9/9/2010 and subject to change prior to ticketing. Any deviation from the tour (depart early or extend the return) must be approved at least 90 days prior to departure and will result in a higher airfare. Seat assignments for groups are all made by Delta group department and will not be known until approximately 30 days prior to departure. Individuals cannot make specific seat requests.
Land Transportation: Land transportation is based on a deluxe air-conditioned motor coach including an English speaking guide. Sightseeing as described in this brochure is subject to local road, weather, and security conditions at the time of the tour. Day-to-day changes in the sequence of sites may be made by the guide and tour leaders. No tour will be taken into any area against the advice of the Department of Tourism in Israel. The tour price is based on a minimum of 30 passengers.
Hotels: Hotels as listed are rated first-class to deluxe as per official government classifications. The tour price is based on two people sharing a double or twin bedded room. A limited number of triple rooms are available for families. Single rooms are available at the supplement of $\$ 850$ whether requested or required.
Meals: All meals are included on the tour from dinner on the day of arrival in Israel through dinner on May 12. Meals consist of full buffet breakfasts and dinners and a variety of lunches at special venues. After meal coffee or hot tea is included with all meals. At some lunches a soft drink may be offered in lieu of coffee/tea. Tips for all meals are included.
